Inverkeithing Heritage Regeneration 2019 — 2024

Inverkeithing has a rich history and heritage, reflected in its large Conservation Area and many listed buildings. Maintaining the buildings and enhancing the charm of the town centre is vital to the success of Inverkeithing, making it better equipped to attract visitors and support those who live and work here.

Fife Council is working with Fife Historic Buildings Trust and the local community to invest in Inverkeithing's historic buildings and streets to support the town's future. The Inverkeithing Heritage Regeneration scheme is funded by The National Lottery Heritage Fund (via its Townscape Heritage programme), Historic Environment Scotland (via its Conservation Area Regeneration Scheme), and Fife Council. Over £3.6 million will be invested in Inverkeithing's heritage during the five-year programme.

The Inverkeithing Heritage Regeneration scheme will focus on the historic High Street area and is made up of a number of related projects:

Inverkeithing Town House

The Town House will be restored to create a vibrant and accessible community hub, which will be managed by a new community organisation.

Building Repair Grant Scheme

A grant scheme for buildings in the High Street area will help private owners to repair or improve their properties using traditional materials and skills. Owners can also get advice on how to look after their historic property and improve energy efficiency.

Historic Streets and Mercat Cross

A major uplift to the High Street and the Market Square will include new paving and the restoration of historic features. The Mercat Cross will be moved from its current location in Bank Street to the heart of the town.
